

Enlargement of School Premises and Increase of Admission Number at Brookfield Primary School

Notice is given in accordance with section 19 (1) of the Education and Inspections Act 2006 that the London Borough of Sutton intends to make a prescribed alteration to Brookfield Primary School, Ridge Road, North Cheam SM3 9LY from 1 September 2012.

The proposal is permanently to enlarge the physical capacity of the School in order to accommodate additional pupils with effect from September 2012. The current capacity of the School is 262 places and the proposed capacity will eventually be 420 places. The current number of pupils registered at the School is 240. The published admissions number for the reception year (YR) intake in September 2012 is 30. It is proposed to increase this to 60. The enlargement of the premises will ensure that the School is able to accommodate 60 pupils at the YR intake point.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Subsequent to the approval of the proposal set out in the Notice, it is the intention of the Local Authority acting in accordance with the guidance in the School Admissions Code 2010, Section 1.21 to make a request to the Schools Adjudicator to increase the admission number of the school at the relevant year (YR) from 30 to 60 for September 2012.

It is planned to enlarge the physical capacity of the School on a phased basis with accommodation for infant aged children being ready by September 2012, followed by a further phase(s) of building to accommodate junior aged children from 2015.
