1. INTRODUCTION

This consultation document explains the Local Authority's proposals to establish a SEN Opportunity Base for children aged 4-7 with learning difficulties at Avenue Primary School from September 2014. Your views are important to us, so please take the opportunity to express your opinion on the proposals in this document.

3. THE CONSULTATION PROCESS

Publication of this document marks the beginning of the consultation process to establish a SEN Opportunity Base at Avenue Primary School. This document will be made widely available and circulated to all schools and to other statutory consultees. It will also be available via the Council's website www.sutton.gov.uk

The public consultation period will end at 5pm on Friday 14 February 2014. If you wish to express any views or comments on the proposals, please let us have your response by no later than the above time and date. All views and responses will be carefully considered before any further decisions on the proposals are made.

There will be a public consultation meeting arranged to look at the possible closure of the SEN Opportunity Base. The meeting will be open to all parents, along with members of the public who are interested in finding out more about the proposals.

Following the end of this period of public consultation, a report will be submitted to the Council's Children, Family and Education Committee (CFEC) at its meeting on 13 March 2014 which will detail responses received and any issues raised during the consultation period. The CFEC will consider these responses before deciding whether to take the proposals forward through the publication of Statutory Proposals which are formal, legal documents which set out the exact details of the change that is being proposed. Following the publication of the Statutory Proposals, there will be a six week Representation Period during which comments and objections can be made on the proposals

Views expressed in the Representation Period will be considered before a final decision is made. This final decision is likely to be taken during the summer 2014 term.

If a final decision cannot be made at that time, then the proposals will be referred to a third party, the Office of the Schools Adjudicator, which will decide them. There is also some scope for certain interested parties, for example, the governing body of the school to which the proposal relates, to appeal to the Schools Adjudicator following the determination of the Statutory Notice if they disagree with the decision.

5. BACKGROUND

There is a pressing need for additional provision for children with learning difficulties in the Borough. The Base at Amy Johnson Primary School is usually full and in the past year, the Authority has had to search for alternative provision for children due to there being no vacancies.

Projecting forward the demographic increase for children with SEN indicates an immediate need for further places for children with learning difficulties at Key Stage 1. Providing a learning base at Avenue Primary School, located to the west of the Borough, would meet this need and improve the balance of provision within the Borough, i.e. the need for places in Central Sutton and to the west of the Borough. Having bases in both Wallington and Belmont would also result in more efficient use of home to school transport where that is required.

The Authority has already invested substantially in new provision for pupils with special educational needs, opening new facilities at Thomas Wall Nursery, Green Wrythe Primary School, Bandon Hill

Primary School, and, in the secondary phase at Glenthorne High School, Stanley Park High School and Carew Manor School, now Carew Academy.

Avenue Primary School has been rated as 'Outstanding' by Ofsted and is a 'teaching school' demonstrating best practice. The School has been identified as a suitable location to provide for children whose prime need is moderate learning difficulties.

The capital cost of changes to accommodate the new opportunity base at the Avenue Primary School site will be around £200k. An application was made to the DfE for grant funding to complete this work and the bid has been successful. The opportunity base can be integrated into the larger project to enlarge the school from 3FE to 4FE and there is every reason to believe that accommodation for the new opportunity base will be available for September 2014.

Emerging from discussions to date, the Governors of Avenue Primary School have indicated their full support for the establishment of a SEN Opportunity Base at the School with effect from September 2014.

6. THE PROPOSAL

The proposal is to open an SEN Opportunity Base for up to 12 children at Key Stage 1 with learning difficulties with effect from September 2014.

Analysis of local data indicates the need for additional provision for children with learning difficulties at Key Stage 1. There is already a local special academy, Carew Academy (previously Carew Manor School), which provides for children and young people with moderate learning difficulties from Year 3, but which does not have classes for Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 pupils. This school will provide the transition route for the majority of pupils when they leave the proposed Opportunity Base at Avenue Primary School, although it is hoped and expected that, with the benefit of specialist early intervention, some pupils will be able to move on to mainstream classes at Key Sage 2 provision near to their homes.

The Base at Avenue School will have a high staffing ratio with a specialist teacher. The pupils will be taught in their own class, following a modified curriculum, and will benefit from opportunities for social inclusion with other pupils of their age at the school. There will also be support from a visiting speech and language therapist. The Opportunity Base will have the benefit of new, purpose built accommodation. The capital grant for this accommodation has already been confirmed. Revenue costs will be met through the School's delegated budget.

Taking the opportunity to develop this new provision is a positive response to requests from parents for more specialist provision to be made in the west of the Borough and will reduce the travel time for children living in Belmont, Sutton, Cheam and Worcester Park, who may otherwise have needed to attend school in specialist provision in Wallington or out of Borough.

The Local Authority has a duty under the Education Act 1996 to secure special educational provision for pupils with special educational needs and to keep that provision under review. When proposing any reorganization of SEN provision, Local Authorities are required to apply the 'SEN Improvement Test', i.e. to demonstrate that the proposed alternative arrangements are likely to lead to improvements in the standard, quality and/or range of educational provision for children with special educational needs.
