

Sutton Council has been looking at buildings and structures in the borough which have heritage value that should be retained and enhanced.


Conservation Area

A new Conservation Area is proposed for part of Sutton High Street, from the Station down to Trinity Square.

This area has a fascinating history, starting as a rural community which grew rapidly during the Victorian era. By the mid 19th Century, the High Street was a wealthy Victorian shopping parade and many of the original buildings can still be seen today. The buildings, particularly at upper storeys, are worthy of preservation and enhancement.

Treasuring and enhancing the unique aspects of the area will help:

- create a stronger local identity
- support the regeneration and promotion of Sutton town centre
- encourage visitors and shoppers
- support retailers and a vibrant town centre



Locally Listed Buildings

Following a call for nominations over 180 buildings and structures are now proposed as possible additions to the Local List. These are all either of historic interest (due to their connection with people or events of local importance) and/or have significant local architectural value.

All the buildings/structures proposed for inclusion make an important contribution to the character and understanding of the history of the Borough. It is important to ensure they are retained and where possible enhanced.
